## Who deals with parking offences?

Parking issues are handled by a mixture of local authority & police powers. Derbyshire County Council will deal with parking issues using Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) as listed in the table overleaf.

Limited waiting bays	Double parking
Double/single yellow lines	Bus stops clearways
On-street pay & display bays	Taxi bays
Residents' parking zones or permit holders' only zones	School keep clears
Blue badge (disabled) bays	Clearways
Loading bays	Dropped kerb access
Council-owned car parks	Pedestrian crossings

Pedestrian crossings (as well as the council)		
Access only (unless access to premises is required)
